Dear Parent / Carer,

During the final 6 weeks of the Summer term, all children from Year 3 – 6, will be participating in Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) lessons as part of their normal Personal, Social, Health and Economic (PSHE) curriculum.

At St. Peter's, we use the Jigsaw scheme of work to support these lessons, which meet the statutory requirements from the new DFE guidance. In Upper Key Stage 2, we will be supplementing these lessons using the online resource, 'Growing Up with Yasmine and Tom' particularly the non-statutory aspects of this subject.

Our school policy for RSE can be found on our school website, which outlines in the appendices, the break down of lesson content for each year group. We have added an additional paragraph about children with SEND. If you require further details about these lessons, please speak to your child's class teacher in the first instance.
